OPINION AND ORDER

The California Trucking Association seeks a revision of the minimum rates governing the transportation of lard compounds, shortenings, glycerides, and other related commodities currently set forth in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 in order to reflect alleged current transportation characteristics.<sup>1/</sup>

Lard compounds and shortenings have been included in Item Nos. 360 and 730 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 since their inception.<sup>2/</sup> The last tariff adjustment involving these commodities was established, effective October 28, 1961, at which time the Commission found that the commodity descriptions specifying lard compounds or shortenings should be amended to include glycerides in various forms.<sup>3/</sup>

Because of similarity in transportation characteristics and uses, and for purposes of tariff simplification, petitioner urges that glycerides, lards, and shortenings should be subject to the same recently updated tariff provisions which now govern shipments of butter, cheese, and margarine.<sup>4/</sup> Accordingly, petitioner requests that Item Nos. 335.5, 606 and 730 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 be amended as set forth in Exhibit A to the petition. It is also proposed that a new commodity description item be established to include butter, cheese, and margarine and to transfer thereto from Item Nos. 360 and 730 the commodity descriptions for glycerides, lard compounds, and shortenings now contained therein. The proposed tariff item is set forth in Exhibit B to the petition.

Except for the suggested addition of the commodity description "cheese foods," no changes are proposed in the existing rates and charges applicable to dairy and related products (butter, cheese, and margarine).

With respect to Item No. 730 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, no changes are recommended by petitioner as to shipments of soap and related articles. The proposed application of the exception ratings in Item No. 335.5 and the point-to-point commodity rates in Item No. 606, now applicable only to dairy and related products, to certain specified glycerides, lard compounds, and shortenings, in lieu of the commodity rates in Item No. 730 and the otherwise applicable class rates named elsewhere in the tariff, will result in both increases and reductions in rates. Ex parte action is requested.

The proposed application of the point-to-point commodity rates in Item No. 606 of the tariff to movements of certain glycerides, lard compounds, and shortenings, in lieu of the provisions of Item No. 730, which now apply to soap, lard and related articles, appears to result in a rather substantial increase in rates.<sup>5/</sup>

The point-to-point commodity rate named in Item No. 730 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, like various other commodity rates in that tariff, was initially established to afford highway carriers an equality of competitive opportunity with the rail lines which maintained like intrastate commodity rates. The rail lines thereafter published lower volume rates which could be, and apparently are, met by for-hire motor carriers under the alternative application of common carrier rate provisions of the tariff. Except for split pickup or split delivery shipments, this alternative application of rail rates by highway carriers substantially reduces the actual application of the point-to-point commodity rate. Moreover, with the recent restriction of the split pickup and split delivery provisions to shipments moving under distance rates, the actual application of the minimum

commodity rate in Item No. 730 is further curtailed.<sup>6/</sup> It is clear that the actual effect of the rate increase proposed is rather minimal. Additionally, the trucking association's overall sought adjustment in the minimum point-to-point commodity rates, together with the sought establishment of related reduced exception ratings, applicable in connection with the minimum distance rates of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, should redound to the mutual benefit of both shippers and carriers.

Copies of the petition were mailed to various shipper associations, chambers of commerce and other interested parties on or about August 12, 1964. Kraft Foods Division of National Dairy Products Corporation on August 24, 1964 filed a formal statement in support of the petition. Several other interested and competing food processors have informed the Commission by letter of their concurrence in petitioner's proposed tariff revisions. All interested parties recommended that the matter be handled ex parte.

It appears, and the Commission finds, that petitioner's proposal is reasonable and justified, and that the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the commodities involved herein. A public hearing is not necessary. The petition will be granted. For tariff clarification the provisions of proposed Item No. 335.6 will be consolidated with ~~Item No. 335.5~~; and Item No. 806, which is now included within the provisions of Item No. 335.5, shall be canceled.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix D of Decision No. 31606, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective December 19, 1964, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A, also attached hereto, and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than December 19, 1964; and the tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective day of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects, said Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
