OBINION

A. Milano, doing business as Milano Trucking Co. seeks a permit as a cement contract carrier in Riverside, Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Orange, Kern, Ventura, Santa Barbara and Imperial Counties.

Public hearing was held before Examiner Power at Los Angeles on October 19, 1964 and the matter was submitted.

Milcho testified for himself and it developed that he had been in cement hauling for a great many years and, inadvertently, he had failed to file this application on the correct form. He had also filed one day late.
