O R D E R

County of Sacramento is hereby authorized to construct two crossings at grade across a spur track of Southern Pacific Company near Mills, Sacramento County, at the locations described in the application to be identified as Crossings Nos. AH-101.8-C and AH-101.9-C, respectively. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost of the crossings outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossings between such lines. Width of crossings shall be not less than forty-eight feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection at each crossing shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant desires to begin construction as soon as possible and has requested immediate authorization. The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
