## OPINION ON REHEARING

By its Decision No. 67920, the Commission ordered that rehearing be granted for the limited purpose of allowing crossexamination of witness Robert E. Nicholson on his direct testimony as recorded on pages 157 through 178 of the transcript, but not as to any part of said testimony that was stricken from the record by ruling of the presiding examiner.

Further public hearing was held on December 22, 1964, in Santa Rosa before Examiner Rowe, at which time counsel for the railroad company cross-examined said witness fully on his direct testimony introduced prior to Interim Order in Decision No. 67307, dated June 3, 1964. Counsel for applicant asked one question on redirect examination. Counsel for the railroad company having stated that he had no further questions of witness Nicholson, the matter on rehearing was duly submitted for decision.

After a careful consideration of the evidence adduced at the rehearing held December 22, 1964, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that this additional evidence indicates no reason for modifying the order in Decision No. 67307.
