ORDER REVOKING WAREHOUSE OPERATIVE RIGHT

The warehouse prescriptive operative right of Merrifield Trucking Company, a corporation, has been suspended since March 31, 1964, for failure to maintain a tariff in effect.<sup>1</sup> The tariff of this warehouseman was canceled by its tariff publishing agent effective January 21, 1964, and it has not filed the required tariff since that date.<sup>2</sup>

Merrifield Trucking Company not having the required tariff on file, the Commission finds that such failure constitutes good cause for the revocation of the prescriptive operative right.

IT IS ORDERED that the public utility warehouse operative right possessed by Merrifield Trucking Company, a corporation, as determined by the order of the Commission dated August 16, 1960, in Case No. 6837, is hereby revoked.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Merrifield Trucking Company or to mail a certified copy thereof to it at its last known address as shown in the Commission's records.
