OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds radial highway common carrier, highway contract carrier and city carrier permits. By Decision No. 66628 dated January 14, 1964, in Application No. 46006, it was authorized to transport flavoring syrup, non-alcoholic beverages and empty containers for the Coca-Cola Company between specified points in southern California, at rates less than the established minimum rates otherwise applicable. The current authority is scheduled to expire with February 7, 1965. By this application, Export Forwarders, Inc., seeks to continue the current authority in effect without change for an additional one-year period.

Applicant states that, while there have been some increases in certain of its operating costs during the past twelve months, such increases have been offset by an increase in volume of traffic and by a greater degree of efficiency in the performance of service for the shipper. It further states that the increased efficiency of its service is due principally to the cooperation of the shipper in tendering shipments so as to obtain maximum use of the carrier's equipment and satisfactory load factors in both directions.

Applicant alleges that it does not anticipate any increase in costs in the next twelve months which would necessitate an increase in the rates currently authorized and that the volume of traffic to be offered it in the ensuing year will be greater than the volume tendered it during the past year. Applicant further alleges that the proposed rates are now, and will be for the ensuing twelve months' period, just, reasonable and fully compensatory. Data furnished by applicant indicate that the transportation involved has been profitable and reasonably may be expected to be profitable in the future.

The certificate of service shows that a copy of the application was mailed to California Trucking Association on December 3, 1964. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates are reasonable. A public hearing is not necessary. The application should be granted. In view of the impending expiration date of the current authority, the order which follows will be made effective February 7, 1965.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Export Forwarders, Inc., is hereby authorized to transport property for the Coca-Cola Company between certain specified southern California points at rates and charges less than the established minimum rates and charges but not less than those set forth in and subject to the conditions specified in Appendices A and B attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. The authority granted herein shall, on and after February 7, 1965, supersede the authority granted by Decision No. 66628 and shall expire with February 7, 1966.

This order shall become effective February 7, 1965.
