P.U.C. IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of the operation of the new or revised rates, classifications, practices or rules set forth on tariff sheets in Schedules Cal. P.U.C. Nos. 1-T, 6-T, 7-T, 53-T and 127-T filed by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company under Advice Letter No. 8791 is hereby extended to and including April 27, 1965, unless otherwise hereafter ordered.
