O P I N I O N

Callison Truck Lines, Inc. requests that "wood chips, in bulk" be deleted from its operating authority as a highway common carrier.

It is alleged that applicant has endeavored to be competitive in the transportation of wood chips in bulk; there are no prescribed minimum rates on said commodity; applicant is, therefore, competing with permitted carriers who are not obligated to file tariffs; and applicant is unable to compete with the permitted carriers.

After consideration the Commission finds that granting of the application would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Callison Truck Lines, Inc. may discontinue the transportation of "wood chips, in bulk" as a highway common carrier.
2. Appendix A of Decision No. 59825, as heretofore amended, is further amended by incorporating therein Third Revised Page 2, attached hereto, in revision of Second Revised Page 2.

3. Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than thirty days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall amend its tariff presently on file with the Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

- e. Applicant, as a highway common carrier, shall not transport any shipments of the following:
- (1) Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
 - (2) Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
 - (3) Articles of unusual value.
 - (4) Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
 - (5) Wood chips, in bulk.

2. a. Callison Truck Lines, Inc., by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport dormant nursery stock, potted plants and cut flowers between McKinleyville and Eureka and points within three miles of Eureka, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, Santa Rosa and San Jose and intermediate points via Napa, Vallejo, Oakland, Hayward, Petaluma and San Francisco.
