ORDER REVOKING PERMIT AND GRANTING CERTIFICATE

Applicant was granted a cement contract carrier permit limited to independent contractor subhauling by ex parte Resolution No. 13820, Sub. No. 39. A petition for reconsideration or rehearing was filed by applicant's attorney, requesting that applicant be granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a cement carrier in all counties sought in his application, as amended, except Plumas County. Said petition was granted by Order Granting Rehearing, dated August 11, 1964.

The application herein was timely filed and is accompanied by shipping documents reflecting delivery of a load of cement to each of the Counties of Colusa, El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, and Sutter by applicant within one year prior to June 1, 1963.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

- I. The cement contract carrier permit limited to independent contractor subhauling granted to Roy F. Peters, doing business as Pete's Trucking Service, by Sub. No. 39 of ex parte Resolution No. 13820, dated June 23, 1964, is revoked.

2. Roy F. Peters, doing business as Pete's Trucking Service, is granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a cement carrier from any and all points of origin to any and all points of destination within the Counties of Colusa, El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, and Sutter.

3. Roy F. Peters, doing business as Pete's Trucking Service, shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:

- (a) Applicant is placed on notice that he will be required, among other things, to file annual reports and to comply with and observe the safety rules of the California Highway Patrol and insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 100 series. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 100 series, may result in a cancellation of the authority granted herein.
- (b) On or before May 1, 1965, applicant shall file tariffs, in triplicate, in the Commission's office, said tariffs to comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in General Order No. 117, and to be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of the authority herein granted, on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public.

The effective date of the authority herein granted shall be ten days after the date hereof.
