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ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHT

The certificate of public convenience and necessity of Jay B. Booth has been suspended since April 19, 1963, for failure to maintain the required tariffs in effect. Booth's tariffs were canceled by his tariff publishing agent effective March 4, 1963, and he has not filed the required tariffs since that date.

Jay B. Booth not having the required tariffs on file, the Commission finds that such failure constitutes good cause for revocation of the certificate.

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The certificate authorizes service as a petroleum irregular route carrier between all points in the State of California south of Redding.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a petroleum irregular route carrier granted to Jay B. Booth by Decision No. 44861 dated October 3, 1950, in Application No. 31625 is hereby revoked.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Jay B. Booth or to mail a certified copy thereof to Jay B. Booth at his last known address as shown in the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be the thirtieth day after such service upon Jay B. Booth or after the above mailing to Jay B. Booth, as the case may be, unless before such effective date there shall have been filed with this Commission a written request for public hearing, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
