ORDER REVOKING WAREHOUSE OPERATIVE RIGHT

The warehouse prescriptive operative right of Cecil H. Fowler and Hazel Del F. Fowler, doing business as C. H. Fowler Warehouse & Elevator, has been suspended since November 11, 1964, for failure to maintain a tariff in effect.¹ The tariff of this warehouseman was canceled by the utility's tariff publishing agent effective October 15, 1964.

Cecil H. Fowler and Hazel Del F. Fowler, doing business as C. H. Fowler Warehouse & Elevator, not having the required tariff on file, the Commission finds that such failure constitutes good cause for the revocation of the prescriptive operative right.

IT IS ORDERED that the public utility warehouse operative right possessed by Cecil H. Fowler and Hazel Del F. Fowler, doing business as C. H. Fowler Warehouse & Elevator, as determined by the order of the Commission dated August 16, 1960, in Case No. 6814, is hereby revoked.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of certified copies of this order to be made upon Cecil H. Fowler and Hazel Del F. Fowler or to mail certified copies thereof to them at their last known addresses as shown in the Commission's records.

¹The prescriptive operative right authorizes service as a public utility warehouseman at Stratford.

The effective date of this order shall be the thirtieth day after such service upon Cecil H. Fowler or Hazel Del F. Fowler, or after the above mailing to Cecil H. Fowler and Hazel Del F. Fowler, as the case may be, unless before such effective date there shall have been filed with this Commission a written request for public hearing in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
