In the matter of the application of the City of Sacramento for an order authorizing construction of a crossing at grade with the tracks of the Southern Pacific Company (Walnut Grove Branch), at 35th Avenue in the City of Sacramento, Sacramento County, California.

O R D E R

The City of Sacramento is hereby authorized to construct 35th Avenue at grade across a track of Southern Pacific Company in the City of Sacramento, Sacramento County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. AU-93.6.

Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. Width of crossing shall be as shown in the application and grades of approach shall be not greater than three percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals equipped with automatic gate arms.

Upon completion the substandard underpass No. AU-93.6-B, at site of new crossing shall be eliminated. Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not

exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant alleges that there is urgency as to timing of construction in that work must be done during April prior to maturity of crops in the Delta. The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
