OPINION AND ORDER

By Petitions for Modification Nos. 373 and 5 in Cases Nos. 5432 and 7857, respectively, California Seed Association seeks various amendments in Minimum Rate Tariffs Nos. 2 and 14-A pertaining to the transportation of seeds.¹ By Petition for Modification No. 6, California Trucking Association seeks to have amended certain rules in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 14-A. Both petitioners ask that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish in their respective tariffs all such modifications as may be prescribed by the Commission's order in these proceedings, including relief from the long- and short-haul provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code.

¹ Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 names statewide minimum rates for the transportation of so-called "General Commodities", including most seeds. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 14-A names statewide minimum rates for the transportation of specific "Agricultural Commodities", including certain seeds, in bulk when subject to minimum weights of 10,000 pounds or more.

California Seed Association proposes to have established in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 a less-truckload exception rating of 90 percent of fourth class for the transportation of seeds generally. It also proposes to have the seed descriptions in Minimum Rate Tariffs Nos. 2 and 14-A broadened to include all seeds described under that heading in National Motor Freight Classification A-8, except cotton and safflower seeds, and to modify the conditions under which the transportation of seeds is exempted from the rates named in such tariffs. As proposed, the broadened description of seeds would permit the "grain" commodity rates in both tariffs to apply to the transportation of seeds generally whereas currently such "grain" rates apply to shipments of a lesser number of specifically designated seeds.

The seed association states that the minimum rate tariff provisions governing the statewide transportation of seeds have not been materially changed or up-dated for many years. It is further stated that the tariffs either completely exempt the transportation of seeds from the rates named therein or provide for the application of class or commodity rates depending upon the particular type of seed shipped and the specific points of origin and destination. The above petitioner contends that the criteria utilized for differentiation between movements of seeds and the resultant charges for the transportation thereof are neither definite nor clear.

California Seed Association avers that the proposed tariff revisions recognize both technological changes in carriers' equipment and changes in current operating practices of shippers and carriers of seeds and that such revisions have been reviewed by various shippers and carriers of seed and their representatives.

California Trucking Association (CTA) in its petition proposes to have the multiple-lot provisions of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 14-A amended so that shipments of whole grains may be picked up by

the carrier within a period of five calendar days instead of two days as currently authorized. It also proposes to have the split pickup and split delivery provisions of the tariff amended so that the carriers may pick up such shipments within a period of two days instead of one day as currently authorized.

CTA states that the proposed multiple-lot amendment is required to reflect the circumstances peculiar to the movement of whole grains wherein harvesting and climatic conditions beyond the control of shipper and carrier are encountered. It is alleged that the other revisions are necessary to provide consistency with recent revisions of related rules in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2.

Both petitioners assert that the proposed revisions in the rates are desired by shippers and carriers. The revisions will result in reductions but no increases in minimum rates. Petitioners also request expedited ex parte action because of the imminent harvest and planting seasons of the commodities involved.

Copies of the verified petitions were served by mail upon known interested shippers, shipper associations and other parties. No objection to the granting of the petitions has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that petitioners' proposals are reasonable and that the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The petitions should be granted. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 will be amended accordingly by the order herein. In order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Minimum Rate Tariff No. 14-A will be amended by separate order.

Other minor changes not related to the subject matter of these petitions will be made in some of the tariff pages of each of the minimum rate tariffs being revised for reasons of tariff clarification only.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix D to Decision No. 31606, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective June 1, 1965, the revised pages listed in Appendix A attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the fifth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
