## OPINION AND ORDER

Walter Sphar operates as a radial highway common carrier. By Decision No. 67159 dated April 28, 1964, in Application No. 46305, he was authorized to assess rates less than the minimum rates but not less than 85 percent of the Class D rates named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, subject to a minimum weight of 44,000 pounds, for the transportation of peat moss from the plant of American Modoc, Inc., at Likely (Modoc County). The current authority is scheduled to expire with May 21, 1965. By this application, applicant seeks an extension of the current authority for a further one-year period.

Applicant states that he has been in the trucking business for the past six years and lives within two blocks of the American Modoc, Inc., plant at Likely where his truck is loaded by the shipper's own employees. He has been hauling peat moss since May, 1961, under prior authorities granted by the Commission, at rates computed on the same classification rating sought herein plus any surcharges and split delivery charges which may be applicable.

Applicant transports the peat moss to points as fer north as Redding and as far south as Bakersfield and has found the current rates to be satisfactory. Applicant further states that he usually averages four loads per week with a minimum weight of 44,000 pounds per load.

Revenue and expense data submitted by applicant indicate that the transportation involved has been profitable and reasonably may be expected to be profitable in the future.

Copy of the application was mailed to California Trucking Association on or about March 24, 1965. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates are reasonable. A public hearing is not necessary. The application should be granted. In view of the impending expiration date of the current authority, the order which follows will be made effective May 21, 1965.

## IT IS ORDERED that:

l. Walter Sphar is hereby authorized to assess rates less than the minimum rates but not less than 85 percent of the Class D rates named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (subject to all other applicable rules and charges in said tariff), subject to a minimum weight of 44,000 pounds, for the transportation of peat moss from the plant of American Modoc, Inc., at Likely (Modoc County), when all loading of the vehicle is done by the shipper.

2. The authority herein granted shall, on and after May 21, 1965, supersede the authority granted by Decision No. 67159 and shall expire with May 21, 1966.

This order shall become effective May 21, 1965.
