ORDER DENYING LEAVE TO INTERVENE

On April 12, 1965, petitioner California Independent Telephone Association, filed a petition for leave to intervene in the instant proceeding because of the alleged impact that any decision rendered in the proceeding would have upon independent telephone companies in California.

Complainants are only requesting an order of the Commission acknowledging the right of customers of The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company to employ personally owned Western Electric Model 500 telephones for extension purposes and to be relieved of tariff charges for such extensions.

In view of the restricted issues raised in the complaint, IT IS ORDERED that petitioner California Independent Telephone Association is denied leave to intervene herein.
