ORDER GRANTING INTERIM RELIEF

Phil Joe, Inc., a corporation, and Philip D. Shatz, President, of 7431 Van Nuys Boulevard, Van Nuys, California, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that defendant discontinued telephone service, under number 787-9857, on or about April 8, 1965, to complainant; that said discontinuance was without legal cause or justification; that complainant operates a cocktail bar business at said address under the name and style of the Plus Parlor, and that telephone service is necessary for the conduct of his business; that the allegation that complainant was using said telephone facilities in violation of law is false and without justification in fact; that complainant has suffered and will continue to suffer pecuniary and patronage loss as a result of said discontinuance of service; that telephone service required by complainant is a public, pay telephone for use of patrons, which is connected to and used with extensions for complainant's business use; that complainant seeks restoration of said telephone facilities forthwith; and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation, is hereby directed to reconnect and restore telephone service to complainant and to maintain such service pending further Commission order herein, and said service to be furnished pursuant

to defendant's filed tariff rates and rules applicable thereto. The complaint will be set for hearing before such Commissioner or Examiner, and at such time and place, as may hereafter be designated.

The Secretary is directed as follows:

1. To cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be served upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its reply within ten (10) days after said service.
2. To cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainant.
3. To cause appropriate notice of hearing to be mailed to the parties at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing herein.
