O P I N I O N

P. C. Cross, doing business as Hemet Bus Line, requests authority to transfer, and his son, S. A. Cross, requests authority to acquire, certain property and operating authority as a passenger stage corporation.

The authority was granted by Decision No. 63027 dated January 9, 1962, in Application No. 43824, modified by Decision No. 68105 in Application No. 46953, and authorizes service between Riverside and Hemet. Included in the transfer are two GMC buses. The transfer includes no cash consideration.

It is alleged that S. A. Cross has had previous experience in the operation herein considered and will continue to provide the same service.

After consideration the Commission finds that the proposed transfer would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. On or before December 1, 1965, P. C. Cross may sell and transfer, and S. A. Cross may purchase and acquire, the operative rights and property referred to in the application.

2. Within thirty days after the consummation of the transfer herein authorized, S. A. Cross shall notify the Commission, in writing, of that fact and within said period shall file with the Commission a true copy of any bill of sale or other instrument of transfer which may be executed to effect said transfer.

3. Applicants shall amend or reissue the tariffs and timetables on file with the Commission, naming rates, rules and regulations governing the common carrier operations herein to show that P. C. Cross has withdrawn or canceled, and S. A. Cross has adopted or established, as his own, said rates, rules and regulations. The tariff and timetable filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff and timetable filings shall be concurrent with the consummation of the transfer herein authorized. The tariff and timetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply in all respects with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Commission's General Orders Nos. 79 and 98.

4. On or before the end of the third month, after the consummation of the transfer as herein authorized, S. A. Cross shall cause to be filed with the Commission, in such form as it may prescribe, an annual report, or reports, covering the period commencing with the first day of the current year to and including the effective date of the transfer.

5. Concurrent with the tariff and timetable filings required by ordering paragraph 3 hereof, the operating authority granted by Decision No. 63027 in Application No. 43824 and as amended by Decision No. 68105 in Application No. 46953 is hereby revoked and in its place and stead a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to S. A. Cross authorizing service as a passenger stage corporation as defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and over the routes more particularly set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORIZATIONS, RESTRICTIONS,
LIMITATIONS, AND SPECIFICATIONS.

The certificate hereinafter noted shall supersede all operative authority heretofore granted to S. A. Cross, doing business as Hemet Bus Line, or his predecessors.

S. A. Cross, doing business as Hemet Bus Line, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport passengers, baggage and express between Riverside, on the one hand, and Hemet, on the other hand, serving the termini and all intermediate points, along the routes as hereinafter described, subject to the following provisions:

- (a) Motor vehicles may be turned at termini or intermediate points, in either direction at intersections of streets or by operating around a block contiguous to such intersections, in accordance with local traffic regulations.
- (b) When route descriptions are given in one direction, they apply to operation in either direction, unless otherwise indicated.
- (c) The transportation of baggage and express shall be incidental to the transportation of passengers, and shall be limited to a weight of one hundred (100) pounds per shipment.

SECTION 2. ROUTE DESCRIPTIONS

Subject to the authority of this Commission to change or modify such at any time, Hemet Bus Line shall conduct its passenger stage operations between the following points and over and along the following described route:

RIVERSIDE - HEMET

Commencing at the Riverside bus terminal at 3734 Market Street, thence along adjacent city streets, U. S. Highway No. 60 and State Highway No. 79 via Gilman Hot Springs and San Jacinto to Hemet.

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
