Application of the City of San Jose, California, Requesting the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California to Order Construction of Certain Protective Devices at The Western Pacific Railroad Crossing of East Santa Clara Street, PUC Crossing No. 4G-16.9 And to Apportion the Construction Costs and Maintenance Costs Thereof.

ORDER

The City of San Jose and The Western Pacific Railroad Company are hereby authorized to install improved automatic crossing protection at The Western Pacific Railroad Company's grade Crossing No. 4G-16.9 at East Santa Clara Street in the City of San Jose, County of Santa Clara, substantially as shown by plan (Exhibit A) attached to the application.

Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) supplemented with additional front and back facing flashing light units mounted on cantilevered arms.

The cost of installation of the automatic signal protection shall be borne equally by the city and the railroad. Allocation of maintenance cost for protective devices at the crossing is deferred until further order of the Commission.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless

time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with.
Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience,
necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days
after the date hereof.
