OPINION

By this petition the California Trucking Association seeks upward adjustments of four to six percent in the rates and charges named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 15 for yearly, monthly and weekly vehicle unit service.

Public hearing was held on May 20, 1965, at San Francisco before Examiner Turpen. Evidence was presented by petitioner's

director of transportation economics and by an engineer and a rate expert from the Commission's Transportation Division staff.

The present minimum rates reflect the cost levels as of July 1, 1964. Petitioner's witness testified that the labor contracts signed last year provide for further wage increases effective July 1, 1965. He introduced an exhibit showing the effect of the wage increases along with the effect of increases in health and welfare payments and Workmen's Compensation Insurance. He also stated that there had been an increase in fuel tax.

The engineer from the Commission's staff introduced an exhibit showing the costs of the yearly and monthly operations as of July 1, 1965. He explained that current wage cost factors were substituted in the basic study prepared in 1962, and the percentage increases over the 1964 costs calculated. The rate expert introduced an exhibit showing proposed rates which reflect the increases in costs as indicated in the cost exhibit. Petitioner's director of transportation economics stated that the rates proposed by the staff appeared reasonable to him, and he requested that his petition be amended to seek adoption of the staff rates.

No one opposed the sought increases.

The evidence is clear that the carriers engaged in transportation subject to the minimum rates here involved will experience increased costs, effective July 1, 1965, to the extent set forth in the exhibits introduced into the record herein.

Upon consideration of all the facts of record, the Commission finds that the increases in rates as set forth in the staff's exhibit are justified and will result in just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates.

The Commission further finds that to the extent that the provisions of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 15 have been found heretofore to constitute reasonable minimum rates and rules for common carriers, as defined in the Public Utilities Act, said provisions, as hereinafter adjusted, are, and will be, reasonable minimum rate provisions for said common carriers. To the extent that the existing rates and charges of said common carriers for the transportation involved are less in volume or effect than the minimum rates and charges herein designated as reasonable for said carriers, to that same extent the rates and charges of said carriers are hereby found to be, now and for the future, unreasonable, insufficient and not justified by the actual competitive rates of competing carriers or by the costs of other means of transportation.

The Commission concludes that Petition for Modification No. 4, as amended at the hearing, in Case No. 7783, should be granted and that Minimum Rate Tariff No. 15 should be amended accordingly.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 15 (Appendix B of Decision No. 65072, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective August 1, 1965, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A, also attached hereto, which pages and appendix by this reference are made a part hereof.
- 2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this

order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and shall be made effective not later than August I, 1965.

- 3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 4. In all other respects, Decision No. 65072, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
