ORDER EXTENDING PERIOD OF SUSPENSION

By order issued herein on May 11, 1965, certain tariffs providing for the offering of Wide Area Telephone Service were suspended, pending hearing, until August 20, 1965 and respondent was directed to furnish the Commission a full cost study of the proposed service by July 20, 1965. It appears that conclusion of the matter may not be accomplished by said date of August 20, 1965.

Good cause appearing therefor,

IT IS ORDERED that the operation and effectiveness of the rates, classifications, practices or rules in the tariffs filed by respondent's Advice Letters Nos. 9034 and 9039, are hereby suspended, as provided by statute, for an additional period of six months to and including February 20, 1966, unless otherwise hereafter ordered.
