Application of GREYHOUND LINES, INC. for Authority to conduct Special Operations between junction Interstate Highway 5 and California Highway 89 (McCloud Junction) and McCloud, Siskiyou County, over California Highway 89.

O P I N I O N

Greyhound Lines, Inc. requests authority to conduct Special Operations over California Highway 89 between McCloud Junction and McCloud.

It is alleged that McCloud is located approximately ten miles southeast of Mt. Shasta City; applicant now possesses substantially all of the authority necessary to handle groups of passengers on an individual-fare basis in Special Operations except for the approximately 3.7 miles between McCloud Junction and McCloud, over California Highway 89; applicant has received a request from a travel service to provide the service; this application is a request for an extension of such Special Operations in order that applicant may afford the requested transportation.

After consideration the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the application. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Greyhound Lines, Inc., authorizing the establishment and operation of service as a passenger stage corporation, as

that term is defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code, for the transportation of passengers, baggage and express between the points and over the routes set forth in Second Revised Page 2-A, attached hereto, as an extension and enlargement of and consolidation with, and subject to all the limitations and restrictions set forth in, the certificate granted by Decision No. 55893 and in particular subject to the provisions set forth in Section 3 of Appendix A. thereof.

2. Appendix A of Decision No. 55893, as heretofore amended, is further amended by incorporating therein Second Revised Page 2-A, attached hereto, in revision of First Revised Page 2-A.

3. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted.
- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file tariffs and timetables, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- (c) The tariff and timetable filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff and timetable filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.

- (d) The tariff and timetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Commission's General Orders Nos. 79 and 98.

The effective date of this order shall be ten days after the date hereof. ✓
