ORDER GRANTING INTERIM RELIEF

CHARLES JOHN ELLIS, of 1901 South Pacific Avenue, San Pedro, California, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that complainant was a subscriber and user of telephone service furnished by defendant under number 832-9468; that on or about May 22, 1965, the telephone facilities of complainant were removed and disconnected by the defendant pursuant to instructions from the Office of the Police of the City of Los Angeles; that complainant does not now intend to use said telephone facilities as instrumentalities to violate the law nor in aiding or abetting such violation; that complainant has no knowledge of any illegal activities being conducted at said premises or over said telephone facilities; that complainant has made demand upon defendant to have said telephone facilities restored, but defendant has refused and does now still refuse to do so; that complainant has suffered and will continue to suffer irreparable injury to his reputation and will suffer great hardship if deprived of said telephone facilities; that complainant is a restaurant owner and cook and is on call at all times during the open hours of the restaurant which business depends in a large part on take out orders by telephone; that it is imperative that complainant have continuous telephone service; that complainant seeks restoration of said
