ORDER

Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to construct a drill track and spur track at grade across Jones Street and a drill track across Leavenworth Street in the City and County of San Francisco, at the locations described in the application, to be identified as Crossings Nos. ED-2.78-C and ED-2.88-C, respectively. Construction of said crossings shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the streets now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding one percent. Protection at each crossing shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or

safety so require.

Applicant alleges that the industry involved desires to proceed as soon as possible with demolition of old structures and relocation of said drill track so that construction of a new improvement on the property may be commenced, and asks that the authorization requested be made effective immediately. The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
