<u>O P I N I O N</u>

Leo E. Kothe and Louis J. Leppo, Jr., a partnership doing business as Leo & Lou Trucking, request a permit to operate as a cement contract carrier from all points within the state to all points and places within the County of San Luis Obispo.

A public hearing was held before Examiner Daly on May 6, 1965 at Santa Maria and the matter was submitted.

Applicants as individuals have been engaged in the trucking business for many years. They have been partners for approximately two years and during that period have been engaged in the transportation of fertilizer, roofing and various products pursuant to a radial highway common carrier permit. They lease and operate a twoacre terminal located in Santa Maria. Upon said property applicants maintain an office and facilities for the maintenance and repair of

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equipment. They own and operate 11 units of equipment including several semi- and full-hopper type trailers. As of October 14, 1964, the partnership indicated a net worth in the amount of \$29,095.

According to applicant Leppo, the partnership has been requested by the manager of the Arroyo Transit Mix Co., which is located in Arroyo Grande, San Luis Obispo County, to transport cement in bulk. The shipments originate at the plants of Riverside Cement Company located in San Bernardino County. Mr. Fred B. Lohmes testified that his company is presently serving the same parties pursuant to "grandfather" authority and that the granting of the requested permit would result in a diversion of all or part of this traffic. Protestants contend, through argument of counsel, that additional carriers would have an unstabilizing effect upon the cement industry as a whole. The Commission takes official notice of the fact that 50 cement carriers and cement contract carriers are now authorized to serve San Luis Obispo County.

During the course of the hearing it was determined that applicant Leppo had received 12 or 13 citations for speeding within the past three years and is presently on probation with the Department of Motor Vehicles. His partner also has received numerous traffic citations for speeding and has just recently been taken off probation by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Two of the conditions which must be found to exist before the Commission may issue a cement contract carrier permit are (1) that the privilege sought will not endanger the safety of the public and (2) that the service of previously certificated cement carriers or permitted cement contract carriers will not be impaired.

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The Commission finds that:

1. Both applicants have committed numerous recent traffic violations; to grant their application would endanger the safety of the public.

2. The granting of the application herein would impair the service of previously certificated cement cerriers and permitted cement contract carriers.

Based on the foregoing findings of fact, the Commission concludes that the application should be denied.

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IT IS ORDERED that the application is denied.
