<u>O P I N I O N</u>

Leonard Silva, doing business as Leonard's Trucking Service, requests a cement contract carrier permit.

A public hearing was held before Examiner Daly on July 8, 1965, at San Francisco. Applicant failed to appear and the matter was submitted upon the application.

According to the application applicant's main place of business is located at Union City. He owns a tractor which is leased to Warren Transportation, and he is employed by said company as a driver. As of December 15, 1964, applicant indicated a net worth IN The amount of \$24,900.

In the event the permit were granted applicant proposes to haul bulk cement for the Mobil-Mix Company only. Said company is located at Union City. However, even this service is questionable for the application discloses that:

"This is the only party this applicant intends to haul bulk cement for and only when said party needs additional equipment beyond its own. It is possible that applicant may never be called upon to haul bulk cement for said party but in case the situation presents itself, applicant wants to be within the requirements of all parties concerned."

Protestants made no affirmative showing.

After consideration the Commission finds that there is insufficient evidence to justify the granting of the requested permit. The application will therefore be denied.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Application No. 47062 is hereby denied.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
