O R D E R

County of Contra Costa is hereby authorized to construct Green Brook Drive at grade across a track of Southern Pacific Company near San Ramon, Contra Costa County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. 80-56.8. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than fifty feet and grades of approach not greater than four percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) equipped with reflectorized "STOP ON RED SIGNAL" signs.

Upon completion, two private grade crossings located at MP 56.58 and MP 56.63 being distant northerly approximately .17 mile and .22 mile, respectively, shall be abandoned and closed by Southern Pacific Company. Within thirty days after completion pursuant to

this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant desires to begin construction as soon as possible and has requested immediate authorization.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
