OPINION AND ORDER

By this petition, California Trucking Association pro-
poses to have exception ratings on synthetic plastic sheets can-
celed from Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B (East Bay drayage area)
and Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1. The ratings in question are
published as exceptions to the classification rating named in the
Governing Classification.¹ Petitioner also asks that common car-
riers be authorized to establish in their respective tariffs such
modifications as may be prescribed by the Commission's order in
this proceeding, including relief from the long- and short-haul
provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code.

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Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B is governed by the provisions of
National Motor Freight Classification A-8 (CAL) as governed by
National Motor Freight Classification A-8, collectively referred
to herein as the Governing Classification. Exception Ratings
Tariff No. 1 contains ratings, rules and regulations, which are
exceptions to the Governing Classification.

Petitioner states that the exception ratings proposed to be canceled from Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B and Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 are the less-truckload fourth class ratings for "synthetic plastic sheets, not woven, not cellular, expanded nor foamed, not finished articles, in packages or wrapped in rolls, in lengths of not less than 100 feet rolled to a diameter of not less than 3 inches." It is averred that the above described commodity is embraced by Item 156835 of the Governing Classification and the same less-truckload fourth class rating is applicable thereto. Petitioner asserts that the proposed deletion of duplicated ratings is necessary for the purpose of tariff simplification and that such revisions will result in neither increases nor reductions.

The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of June 22, 1965. Copies of the verified petition were mailed to various chambers of commerce, shipper organizations and carrier representatives on or about June 18, 1965. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that petitioner's proposal should be adopted. A public hearing is not necessary. The petitions should be granted. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B will be amended accordingly by the order herein. In order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 will be amended by separate order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B (Appendix B of Decision No. 65834, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein,

to become effective October 2, 1965, Third Revised Page 7 and Fifth Revised Page 35 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and shall be made effective not later than October 2, 1965.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the exception rating authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the exception rating published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects, Decision No. 65834, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
