Application of the State of California,
 Department of Public Works, for an order
 authorizing construction of two crossings
 at separated grades whereby State Route
 520 will be carried over the main line
 tracks of the Southern Pacific Company
 (Sacramento via Niles), referred to as
 "East Midway Overhead", and the main line
 tracks of The Western Pacific Railroad
 Company (Oakland Pier to Nevada State
 Line), referred to as "West Valpico
 Overhead", in San Joaquin County.

ORDER

The State of California Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to construct State Route 520 at separated grades over the tracks of Southern Pacific Company and The Western Pacific Railroad Company, near the City of Tracy, in San Joaquin County, at the locations and substantially as shown by map (Exhibit B) attached to the application, referred to respectively as "East Midway Overhead" to be identified as Crossing No. D-65.0-A, and "West Valpico Overhead" to be identified as Crossing No. 4-66.6-A. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with agreements entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copies of said agreements, together with plans of said crossings approved by Southern Pacific Company and The Western Pacific Railroad Company, respectively, shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days from the date hereof. Clearances shall be in accordance with requirements of General Order No. 26-D, except that during the period of construction of the East Midway Overhead and the West Valpico Overhead, a clearance of 22'0" above top of rail is authorized provided Southern Pacific Company and The Western Pacific Railroad Company issue appropriate bulletins to

train and enginemen advising them of the temporarily impaired clearance conditions and forbidding trainmen to ride on tops of cars while operating beneath the structures.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years, unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
