ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHT

Jack Bettencourt and Frank Bettencourt, doing business as Bettencourt Bros., possess a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of livestock over the major highways of California.¹ They have informed the Commission by letter that their future operations can be adequately performed under their permitted authority and request that their highway common carrier operative authority be revoked.

In the circumstances, it appears and the Commission finds, that the revocation of the certificate of public convenience and necessity as requested will not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The certificate

should be revoked and the tariffs applicable to the services thereunder should be canceled.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier granted to Jack Bettencourt and Frank Bettencourt by Decision No. 52507 dated January 23, 1956, in Application No. 36327 is hereby revoked.

2. The participation of Jack Bettencourt and Frank Bettencourt, doing business as Bettencourt Bros., is hereby canceled from the following tariffs issued by West Coast Freight Tariff Bureau, Inc., Richard A. Bennett, Agent:

Local Tariff No. 1-A, Cal.P.U.C. No. 5.

Distance Table No. 4-B, Cal.P.U.C. No. 18.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
