OPINION AND ORDER

Public hearing was held before Examiner Porter in San Francisco on September 7, 1965, at which time the matter was submitted.

The Southern Pacific Company, the City of Daly City and the staff of the Public Utilities Commission stipulated that the crossing of School Street be protected by Standard No. 8 flashing light signals and that the cost of installation be apportioned 50 percent to the City and 50 percent to Southern Pacific.

The Commission finds and concludes that the stipulation should be accepted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The School Street Crossing No. EM-8.2 be protected with Standard No. 8 flashing light signals installed within 90 days of the effective date of this order.

2. The cost of installation be apportioned 50 percent to the City of Daly City and 50 percent to Southern Pacific Company.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
