OPINION AND ORDER

By this petition, as amended, California Trucking Association seeks to have amended certain provisions in Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1, which pertain principally to the released value requirements governing the exception ratings on other-than-uncrated household goods. Petitioner also asks that common carriers be directed to establish in their respective tariffs such modifications as may be prescribed by the Commission's order in this proceeding, including relief from the long- and short-haul provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code.

Petitioner proposes, in addition to minor changes, to delete wording concerning the aforementioned released value requirements from Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 and to substitute therefor

The exception ratings are set forth in Items Nos. 640 and 660 of Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1. This tariff contains classification ratings and rules which are exceptions to the provisions of the Governing Classification in connection with transportation performed under Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (General Commodities - Statewide) and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 5 (Los Angeles Drayage Area). The term "Governing Classification" when used herein means National Motor Freight Classification A-8 (CAL) as governed by National Motor Freight Classification A-8.

other wording subjecting the less-truckload and truckload exception ratings in Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 on other-than-uncrated household goods to the released value requirements of the Governing Classification, which are the same as those currently in effect.

Ratings Tariff No. 1 were established by the Commission prior to the adoption of the Governing Classification and that various provisions in the notes under the heading of "Household Goods Group" in the latter publication are similar in content to the notes and other provisions set forth in the above tariff. It is alleged that the changes and charges resulting from the correlation of the current provisions in Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 with those set forth in the Governing Classification, as proposed, are minor and that there is no apparent justification for the variance in such provisions which now exists. Petitioner asserts that the proposed revision clarifies the released value requirements concerning less-truckload shipments and is consistent with the original intent of such released value provisions.

Copies of the verified petition and amendments thereto were served upon various chambers of commerce, shipper organizations and carrier representatives. The petition and the first and second amendments thereto were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of June 15, June 29 and July 20, 1965. No objection to the granting of the petition, as amended, has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that petitioner's proposal is reasonable and that the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation of the commodity involved. A public hearing is not necessary. We conclude that the petition, as amended, should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 (Appendix A of Decision No. 66195, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective November 27, 1965, Eighth Revised Page 3, Third Revised Page 22 and Third Revised Page 23 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than tendays' notice to the Commission and to the public and shall be made effective not later than November 27, 1965.
- 3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the exception ratings authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the exception ratings

published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing the long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects, Decision No. 66195, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
