ORDER REINSTATING OPERATING AUTHORITIES  
AND EXTENDING TIME FOR PAYMENT OF FINE

Whereas by Decision No. 69374, issued herein July 7, 1965,  
which became effective August 8, 1965, respondent John R. Webb was  
ordered to pay a fine of \$1,735.77, on or before August 28, 1965, and

Whereas by Resolution No. 14685, dated September 14, 1965,  
the highway common carrier certificate issued to John R. Webb by  
Decision No. 62797, dated November 14, 1961, in Application  
No. 43790, and the Radial Highway Common Carrier Permit No. 19-52524  
issued to John R. Webb were suspended by reason of his failure to pay  
said fine, and

Whereas by letter, dated October 12, 1965, said John R. Webb  
submitted a cashier's check in the amount of \$975.00 in partial pay-  
ment of said fine, promised to pay the balance of said fine on or  
before December 15, 1965, and requested reinstatement of his operating  
authorities, now therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The suspension of the operating authorities of John R. Webb,  
respondent herein, provided in Resolution No. 14685, dated  
September 14, 1965, is terminated, and the operating authorities  
issued to John R. Webb by Decision No. 62797, dated November 14, 1961,  
in Application No. 43790, and by Radial Highway Common Carrier Permit  
No. 19-52524 are reinstated.

2. The time within which respondent John R. Webb is ordered to pay the balance of the fine in the amount of \$760.77 pursuant to paragraph 2 of the order in Decision No. 69374, dated July 7, 1965, in Case No. 8074 is extended to December 15, 1965.

Letter, dated October 12, 1965, from J. R. Webb to Mr. Grant Syphers, Director, and Memorandum, dated October 26, 1965, from J. W. Mulgrew, Director of Transportation, to George E. Howard, Chief Examiner, are hereby made a part of the formal file in this proceeding.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.

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Decision No. 69374 in Case No. 8074, which became effective August 8, 1965, ordered Webb to pay a fine of \$1,735.77 on or before August 28, 1965. By Resolution No. 14685, dated September 14, 1965, the highway common carrier certificate and radial highway common carrier permit held by Webb were suspended on that date for failure to pay the fine.

The attached letter from Webb remits a cashier's check for \$975.00 in partial payment of the fine and requests extension of time to pay the remaining balance of \$760.77 on or before December 15, 1965. He also asks reinstatement of his suspended operating authorities.

The cashier's check referred to in the letter has been forwarded to the Accounting office.

The Transportation Division has no objection to the request. It is suggested that the order extending time for payment of fine also include an order reinstating Webb's operating authorities.
