ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Simon's Beverly, Inc., requests authority for the transfer to it of the water system owned by Burke Enterprises, Inc.

By Commission letter dated January 22, 1965, a copy of which is hereby received in the record as Exhibit No. 1, applicant was advised of specific deficiencies in the application. The letter stated that applicant could present the missing information at a hearing or could file an amendment to the application. Inasmuch as no amendment was filed, a public hearing on the application was held by Examiner Catey at Los Angeles on April 6, 1965. Applicant was not prepared to proceed, so the hearing was adjourned to a time and place to be set, with the understanding that applicant would file the necessary amendment.

By Commission letter dated May 10, 1965, a copy of which is hereby received in the record as Exhibit No. 2, applicant was given several specific suggestions as to the scope of the amendment and was requested to reply promptly. No reply nor amendment has been received from applicant.

By Commission letter dated October 20, 1965, a copy of which is hereby received in the record as Exhibit No. 3, applicant was advised that this order of dismissal was being prepared. No reply has been received from applicant.
