O P I N I O N

These matters were heard on a consolidated record and were submitted September 2, 1965, before Examiner Thompson at San Francisco. Copies of the petitions and notice of hearing were served in accordance with the Commission's procedural rules.

California Trucking Association requests revisions of the descriptions of canned goods and foodstuffs contained in City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A, Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B, and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. It is proposed that the descriptions of the articles be related to items in the National Motor Freight Classification. For example, Item No. 320 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2

lists "Mince Meat" as a commodity to which the canned goods ratings are applicable; petitioner proposes that the listing be changed to "Mince Meat as described in Item No. 74050 [of the Governing Classification]." The general classification description set forth in said Item No. 74050 is "Mince Meat". While some of the descriptions in the governing classification are more complex than is the case with mince meat, the foregoing example illustrates the intention of petitioner with respect to its proposal; that is, the commodities listed in the exceptions to the classification be designated by reference to the numerical listing of a particular item in the National Motor Freight Classification. The reasons for the proposed revisions were explained by petitioner,

"The purposes of the proposed revisions in description are to provide an increased definiteness and certainty as to the application of the descriptions, and to provide a tariff format more compatible with pending and prospective innovations in electronic billing and rating techniques involving both shipper and carrier operations. This is part of a general program of tariff modernization instituted recently by Petitioner (i.e., see Decision No. 69170, Case No. 5432)."

Petitioner's director of research testified motor carriers have been endeavoring to utilize the advantages of computers for rating, billing and statistical purposes. In order to program a computer for such purposes it is necessary to codify into digits the descriptions of the commodities transported and the place names of the points of origin and destination. With respect to the codification of commodities, the association has determined to make use of the index or item numbers in the National Motor Freight

Classification. This will achieve the desired result in connection with shipments moving under class rates except those subject to exception ratings. The director stated that in order to put the exception ratings into the program for the computer it is necessary to utilize the same numbering system or code. The computer is not able to rationalize and therefore the codification must be precise and not be ambiguous. He said that it is not the intention of petitioner herein to change any ratings on any commodities. Petitioner requests that mushrooms and preserves be added to the canned goods commodity listing for the purpose of clarification. The director asserted that shippers and carriers have always considered that those articles are subject to the ratings on canned goods; mushrooms being rated as vegetables and preserves being rated as jams. He said that as there is doubt as to the propriety of describing mushrooms as vegetables and preserves as jams it is desirable to dispel this doubt by amending the list of commodities subject to the canned goods ratings to include them. It was also pointed out that because mushrooms are specifically indexed by name with an item number, such description or number should be included in the canned goods listing so that it can be programmed into the computer.

California Manufacturers Association (C.M.A.) opposes the petition. It asserted that the suggested change would require shippers to designate the National Motor Freight Classification item number of commodities on bills of lading which would change present shipping procedures and thereby cause shippers unnecessary expense. It also asserted that the proposed change could result in increased rates to some shippers because it has not been conclusively shown that the proposed listing includes all articles that presently

move, or would move in the future, under the present exception rating. It further contends that under the proposed listing changes in the exception rating could be accomplished by the National Motor Freight Association by changing descriptions in its classification.

The interested parties and the Commission staff participated by indicating certain commodities that may have been overlooked by petitioner. As a result of such participation, petitioner amended its proposed listing to include frozen egg yolks, sauerkraut and sauerkraut juice, apple cider, and frozen soups. Said commodities are subject to the present exception rating.

The value of the computer for data processing cannot be denied. The transportation industry should be allowed, and encouraged, to take advantage of technological improvements which will enable it to perform service more efficiently and at lower costs. We need concern ourselves here only with the question of whether the proposal of petitioner, which seeks to translate the tariffs into language the computer can understand, will be injurious to the carriers or to the public. Protestant has advanced some arguments in that regard.

The proposal herein will not require shippers to change their practices with respect to the tender of shipments. It must be noted that it is the responsibility of the carrier to issue a shipping document (bill of lading or comparable shipping order) setting forth a description of the property constituting the shipment. It is true that most shippers prepare the shipping documents; however, if such shipper should describe the commodity in a shipment as "apple cider in cans" instead of "Juice, fruit, as described in Item No. 74720" that shipment would nevertheless be subject to the rates applicable to canned goods. The proposal

would place no burden upon the shipper. There is indication that petitioner is exploring the possibility of the establishment of a centralized rating bureau which would provide subscribers with information concerning the rates and charges of shipments almost instantaneously through the use of a computer. It is possible that such service may be available to shipper subscribers, or where shippers already have computers enable them to set up a program similar to that contemplated by the carriers.

It must be conceded that it cannot be said conclusively that each and every commodity now moving under the canned goods ratings have been included in the list of articles proposed by petitioner. Some omissions were shown at the hearing and petitioner amended its suggested listings accordingly. The director of research testified that he had discussed petitioner's proposal with representatives of shippers known to him to tender quantities of shipments of canned goods and had asked for suggestions. Notices of hearing in this petition were served in accordance with the Commission's procedural rules and a public hearing was held. While it cannot be stated conclusively that all commodities subject to the present exception ratings on canned goods are set forth in the proposed list, the evidence provides reasonable grounds for finding that most, if not all, of the commodities have been included in the listing. The orders of the Commission in these proceedings are served upon all carriers and shippers who have been served with, or who subscribe to, the minimum rate tariffs here involved. Such orders, therefore, have wider distribution to the public than do the notices of hearing. In order to further reduce the possibility of an inadvertent omission of some article or commodity from the listings, the effective date of the proposed change should be

postponed to a date sufficiently in the future to provide opportunity for any such omissions to be directed to the attention of the Commission prior to any changes in rates that might result from the order.

With respect to protestant's allegation that the National Motor Freight Traffic Association could change the application of the exception ratings merely by changing the item numbers for descriptions of articles, we need only point out that before any changes in the National Motor Freight Classification can be made effective to California intrastate transportation they must be approved by the Commission.

The Commission finds that:

1. Adoption of the changes proposed by petitioner are intended to result neither in any increases nor reductions in rates.
2. Any increases in rates by common carriers that might possibly result from the adoption of the proposed changes have not been justified.
3. The proposed changes will clarify and make more definitive the provisions of the minimum rate tariffs and are desirable.

We conclude that the proposed changes should be adopted to be made effective not earlier than ninety days after the effective date of this order so as to afford opportunity to persons to direct any inadvertent omissions to the attention of the Commission.

In order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution the order herein will provide for appropriate amendments to Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2; Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B and City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A will be amended by separate orders.
