O P I N I O N

By order dated March 30, 1965, the Commission ordered a rehearing of Decision No. 68431 limited to the following: (1) cross-examination of witnesses upon the testimony received at the hearing held in Fresno on October 20, 1964; (2) receipt of evidence and argument on behalf of petitioners; (3) any other purpose which the presiding Commissioner or Examiner might deem necessary to a proper disposition of the case.

Public hearing was held before Examiner Porter in San Francisco on September 21 and October 1, 1965.

The witnesses who appeared at the Fresno hearing repeated their direct testimony and were cross-examined with the exception of Mr. Hartsock who did not appear. His testimony will be stricken.

John Geijsbeek testified in substance that the shippers controlled the rates and he had to accede to the shippers' computation of freight charges in order to stay in business.

After consideration the Commission finds that there is no evidence which would justify altering the findings and conclusions set forth in Decision No. 68431.

The Commission concludes that the order set forth in Decision No. 68431 should be affirmed.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that the order in Decision No. 68431 is affirmed.

The Secretary of the Commission is directed to cause personal service of this order to be made upon respondents and the effective date of the order in Decision No. 68431 as to each respondent shall be twenty days after the service of this order upon said respondents.
