Application of the County of Santa Clara,  
 State of California, for an order authori-  
 zing construction of a crossing at grade  
 over the tracks of the Southern Pacific  
 Company in connection with the construc-  
 tion of Central Expressway in Santa Clara  
 County.

ORDER

The County of Santa Clara is hereby authorized to construct Central Expressway at grade across an industrial track of Southern Pacific Company near Sunnyvale, in Santa Clara County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. E-41.8-C.

Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto. Copy of said agreement shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.

Width of the crossing shall be not less than seventy-four feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by four Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B), with the two signals at the shoulders supplemented with automatic gate arms and the center two signals placed on raised median strips. Back lights may be omitted on the median signals.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
