

ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By its application herein, Benicia Industries, Inc., a California corporation, sought a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the construction of a public utility telephone system for service to and within the former United States Military reservation commonly known as the Benicia Arsenal.

Public hearing in the matter was held before Examiner Emerson on October 27 and 29, 1965 during which eight witnesses were heard and sixteen exhibits received. On November 22, 1965, prior to calendared resumption of public hearing, counsel for applicant informed the Examiner that applicant had negotiated a
