IT IS ORDERED that the 229th Revised Sheet 1, 98th Revised Sheet 1-A, 1st Revised Sheet 54-J and Original Sheet 92 of Schedule Cal. P.U.C. No. 83-T, filed under Advice Letter 9118 by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, are permanently suspended and Case No. 8259 is discontinued.
