## SECOND INTERTM OPINION

After notice to all affected parties all matters insted above were consolidated for hearings and hearings were held in Los Angeles before Examiner Rogers on October 13, 14 and 15, 1965. Certain of the crossings involved have been heretofore authorized (Decision No. 69865, dated October 26, 1965, in Application No. 45889; Decision No. 70064, dated December 7, 1965, In Case No. 8214 and applications listed above).

On November 2, 2965, the applicant and the County of Los Angeles filed a stipulation that the crossings specified in the ordex herein be submitted on the record now before the Comission.

The applicant submitted evidence of the number of lanes of traffic, the width, the angle, the grades of approach, the view conditions, the distances to the nearest crossings, the train
speed, the vehicle speed, the average daily vehicie and train traffic and the proposed protection or construction at each of the erossings berein considered.

The County presented evidence relative to said crossings and the construction or protection as requested thereat (Exhibit 75). At Avenue "I" and 90th Street East the County recommended separations of gredes rather than flashing lights supplemented with artomatic gates as proposed by the applicant.

The County witness stated that 90 th Street East provides access to Edwards Air Force Base; that the average daily traffic thereon is 1,670 vehicles and that it is to be developed as a major bighway on the County's master plan of highways.

The County desires a separation of grades at Avenue " I " for the reason that it is to be a major east-west highway extending from Sierra Highway on the west to 165th Street East on the east, a distance of 15 miles. The average dally traffic at present is 271 vehicles according to the County. The County witness stated that If this separation of grades is constructed 98th SEreet East could be closed.

Each of the streets or bighwayg bercin referred to is on the County's master plan of ingkways (Exhibit 74), adopted in 1940.

Both 44th Street East and Black Butte Basin Road are plomed for 60-foot County roads and 92nd Street East is to be an 80-foot secondary highway. The remadring strcets or bighways are to of 100 -foot major highways. At present the streets vary from 20 feet in width to 40 feet in width. When the streets or bighways will be developed according to the mastex plan, was not.stated:

Fresent average daily traffic varies Exom one vehicle (Black Butte Easin Road) to 1,635 vehjeles (90th Street East).

On the evidence of record the Comission finds that:

1. The proposed crossings hezein considered are all in the County of Los Angeles. Each of the proposed crossings will be a new crossins, constructed at the applicant's request, of on existing street, highway of dedicated right of way therefor. The Interstate Commerce Comission has authorized the construction of said Cutoff.
2. Pubiic convenience, necessity and safety require that each of the crossings herein authorized be constructed under the tems and conditions contained in the order herein. Each sepaxation of grade structure authorized herein should be constructed to accommodate a street or highway of the width shown on the County's master plan of highways.
3. The closing of certain streets or highways across the right of way as authorized herein will not be adverse to the public interest.
4. All separated grade structures and approaches specified herein should be constructed pursuant to agreements between the parties concerned.

The factual findings relative to the Palmale-Colton Cutoff contained in Decision No. 69865, supra, are adopted by reference and made a part of the above findings insofar as pertinent.

## Conclusions

The Comission concludes thet the applicant should be authorized to construct each of the crossings specified herein uncer the terw and conditions specified in the order herein and that certain crossing sites should be closed as specified in the order hercin.
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## SECOND INTERIM ORDER

## II XS ORDERSD that:

1. Southern Pacific Company is bereby authorized to con-
struct a line of track across the streets and bighways apecified berein, the crossings to be identified by the crossing numbers epecified and subject to the conditions set forth at each crossing. Construction and protection shall be as speciffed at each of said crossings.

25th Strect East (Crossing No. BB 416.4.B)
Applicant is authorized to construct this crossing at eeparated grades. Clearances shell be in accordance with the requirements of General Oxder No. 26-D. Plans approved by the Los Angeles Coumty Road Department shall be filed with the Commission prior to the commencement of construction.

372h Street East (MP-417.85)
Applicant is authorited to close this street across the xight of way provided it connects sald street to 40 th Street East
(Crossing No. BB 418.1) as proposed by applicant.
40th Street East (Crossing No. BB 418.1)
Width of the crossing shall be 26 feet, and applicant shall pave said crossing with asphaltic concrete for said width across the full width of the right of way. Grades of approach shall not be greater than 4 per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection sbali be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Oxder No. $75-\mathrm{B}$ ) suppiemented with automatic crossing gates.

44 th Street East (Crossing No. BB 418.6)
Whtth or the crossing shall be 26 feet, and applicant shall pave said crossing with asphaltic concrete for said width across the fuli width of the right of way. Grades of approach shall not be greater than 4 per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. I crossing signs (General order No. 75-B) with reflex reflecting sbeet material.

47th Street East (Crossing No, BB 418.8)
WIdth of the crossing shall be 30 feet, and applicant shall pave said crossing with asphaltic concrete for said width across the full width of the right of way. Grades of approach 3hall not be greater than 4 per cent. Construction shail be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shali be by two Standard No. I crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) with reflex reflecting sbeet matexial.
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90 th Street East (Crossing No. BB 422.9)
Mppliconi 1 anthoxifed to constxuct this crossing at separated grades. Clearances shall be in accordance with the requirements of General Order No. 26-D. Plans approved by the Los Angeles County Road Department shell be filled with the Comilssion priox to the comencement of construction.

92nd Street East (Crosging No. BB 423.3)
Width of the crossing ahall be 26 feet, and applicant shall pave seid crossing with espheiltic concrete for said width across the ExII width of the right of way. Grades of approach shall not be greater than 4 per cent. Construction shail be equal or superiox to Standard No. 2 of seneral Ordex No. 72. Frotection ahall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) with reflex reflecting sheet matexial.

96th Stxect Eabt (Crossing No. BB 423.87)
Widta of the cxossing shall be 26 feet, and applicant shall pave said cressing with asphaitic concrete for said width across the full width of the right of way. Grades of approach shall not be greater than 3.75 per cont. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be oy two Standard No. 8 Elashing light signals (General Order No. 75-8) sypplemented with automatic crossing gates.

98th Street East (MP-424.13)
Appiliant is authorized to close this street at the limits of applicant 's right of way provided a separation of grades is constructed at Avenue "T" (Crossing No. BB 424.3).
Averue "T" (Crossing No. BB 424.3)
Applicant is घutionized to construct this crossing at separated grades. Clearences shall be in accordance with the requixements of General Ordex No. 26-D. Plans approved by the Los Angeles Comnty Road Department shall be filled with the Comission prior to the comencement of construction.

106th Street East (Crossing No. BB 424.9)
WIdth ot the crossing shall be 40 feet, and spplicant shall pave said crossing with aspheltic concrete for said width across the Evil width of the right of way. Grades of approach shail not be creater than 3 per cent. Construction shail be equal or superior to Standird No. 2 of Geseral Order No. 72. Protection sball be by two Stancard No. 1 crossing signs (General Oxder No. 75-B) witis reflex reflecting sheet material.

116th Street East (Crossing No. BB 425.9)
Width of the crossing skeil be 40 feet, and applicant shall pave soid croasing with asphaltic concrete for said width scross the full width of the riglat of way. Grades of approach shall not be Sreater than 2 per cent. construction shali be equal or superiox to Standard No. 2 of General oxder No. 72. Protection shali be by two Stondard No. 1 crossing olgon (General 0rder No. 75-B) with reflex reflecting sbeet material.
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165th Street East (Cmossing No, BB 431.0)
Width of the crossing shall be 26 feet, and applicant shall pave said crosstng with asphaltic concrete for sadd width across the full width of the zight of way. Gredes of apprasch abail not be greater than 4 per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Stendand No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. \& flashing light signals (Gereral Order No. $75-B$ ) supplewentod with automatic croscing gates.

32 nck Butte Rasin Road (Crossing No. B3 436.4)
WIctio of the crossing shail De 26 feet, and applicant shall pave said crossing with esphaltic concrete for said width across the full width of the right of way. Grades of approach shall not be Greater than 2.8 per cent. Congtruction sball be equal or superio: to Stamiord No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protcetion shall be by two Standard No. 1 crosaing sigps (General. Orderi No. 75-B) with reflex refiecting sheet material.
palmale-Victorville Road (Crossing No. EB 440.9)
Applicant is authorizec to construct tils crossing at separated grades. Clearances shail be in accordance with the requirementio of Genexal Order No. 25-D. plans approved by the Los Angeles County Road Depariment shall be filled with the Comission prior to the commencement of construction.

County Line Road (MP-441.3)
Applicant is authorired to close said crossing provided it conpects the County Line Road to the palmale-Victorville Road (Crossing No. BB 440.9) as proposed by applicant.
2. Ail costs of construction at each of said grade crossings, closures and new roads specified hexein, other than grade separatioss, shall be borne by applicant. Applicant shall bear all mointenince coets of grade crobsings of its trackes between lines two feet outside of its rails and sball bear 211 maintenance costs of automatic protective devices and nomarcmatic protective devices. The County sball maintain the pevement at each grade crossing outside of the ifnes two feet outside of the rails. At those crossings where there dre separations of grades, construction and maintenance coats shall be borne in accordance with orreements to be entered into betaeen the applicant and the Ios Angeles County Road Department and a copy of each of said
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agreements together with plans approved by the County shall be filed with this Commission prior to commencement of construction of the grade separation structure involved. Should the parties fail to agree the Compassion will apportion the costs by further order.

Within thirty days after completion of each crossing pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise this Commission in writing. This authorization will expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof
