OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 70254 entered today in this proceeding found that provisions of Items Nos. 260, 280 and 300 of Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 should be amended and that such amendment should be accomplished by the issuance of a separate order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 (Appendix A of Decision No. 66195, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein to become effective February 19, 1966, First Revised Page 12 and First Revised Page 13 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and shall be made effective not later than February 19, 1966.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent

necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects, Decision No. 66195, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
