ORDER DENYING PETITIONS TO EXTEND
EFFECTIVE DATE AND MODIFY
DECISION NO. 69447 AND REOPEN PROCEEDING

American Airlines, Inc. having filed a petition herein on February 3, 1966 requesting extension of the date by which service observing equipment must be equipped with a notice device and reopening of the proceeding for the purpose of adducing additional evidence, or alternatively requesting that Decision No. 69447 herein be modified to permit the use of service observing equipment without the requirement of a notice device subject to certain conditions, and California Manufacturers Association having filed a petition herein on February 11, 1966 requesting reopening of the proceeding and authorization for the continued use of PBX monitoring equipment, the Commission having considered each and every allegation contained therein, and being of the opinion that no good cause for the relief sought is set forth;

IT IS ORDERED that the Petitions of American Airlines, Inc. and California Manufacturers Association To Reopen Investigation be, and the same are hereby, denied.
