ORDER REVOKING WAREHOUSE OPERATIVE RIGHT

H. L. Meiners and J. L. Dillon, doing business as Mount Shasta Milling Co., possess a prescriptive operating right as a public utility warehouseman for the operation of 5,000 square feet of storage or warehouse floor space at Montague. J. L. Dillon has informed the Commission by letter that the company is no longer operating as a public utility warehouseman and requests that the prescriptive operative right be revoked.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the revocation of the prescriptive operative right as requested will not be adverse to the public interest. The Commission concludes that the prescriptive operative right should be revoked and the tariff applicable to the services thereunder should be canceled. A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman possessed by H. L. Meiners and J. L. Dillon doing business as Mount Shasta Milling Co., as determined by order dated August 1, 1960, in Case 6709, is hereby revoked.
2. Warehouse Tariff No. 2, C.R.C. No. 2, of Mount Shasta Milling Company is hereby canceled.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon H. L. Meiners and J. L. Dillon or to mail a certified copy thereof to them at their last known address as shown in the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be the thirtieth day after such service upon H. L. Meiners and J. L. Dillon or after the above mailing to them unless before such effective date there shall have been filed with this Commission a written request for public hearing, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
