OPINION AND ORDER

On December 10, 1965, The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company filed its Advice Letter No. 9202 and accompanying tariff sheets by which its Angels Camp telephone exchange would be expanded to include an area of about 40.7 square miles to the north and east of the existing boundaries of said exchange. Such expanded area lies within the area of a new exchange sought to be established by Application No. 48123 of Calaveras Telephone Company. Because of the territorial conflict involved, the Commission, by Decision No. 70148, suspended the tariff sheets of the Pacific Company pending investigation and hearing of the matters.

By letter of February 14, 1966, Calaveras has withdrawn its application. The conflict has thus been dissolved and there now appears to be no reason why Pacific Company's filings should not be permitted to become effective.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The order of suspension and investigation, Decision No. 70148, is hereby set aside and the investigation contemplated by Case No. 8324 is hereby terminated.

2. Tariff sheets filed by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company with its Advice Letter No. 9202, viz.: 1550th Revised Sheet 1 and 5th Revised Sheet 9 of Schedule Cal. P.U.C. No. 37-T, are hereby permanently suspended.

3. The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company is hereby directed to refile those certain tariff sheets previously filed under Advice Letter No. 9202 with new sheet numbers under a new advice letter number, to become effective on not less than five days' notice to the public and to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
