In the Matter of the Application of
M AND M TRANSFER COMPANY, a
California corporation, for suspension
of certificated rights as a highway
common carrier as to certain commo-
dities between certain points.

O P I N I O N

M and M Transfer Company, presently authorized to trans-
port general commodities between points in the Los Angeles area,
requests authority to suspend a portion of its operations as a
certificated carrier until June 1, 1967.

Specifically, applicant wishes to suspend its certifi-
cated service for the Union Carbide Corporation, which is located
at Torrance. During the period of suspension applicant proposes
to provide service to this customer pursuant to its contract
permit.

It is alleged that applicant has served Union Carbide
Corporation for almost ten years within its certificated area.
Recently this customer's delivery area was extended and due to
the mixed shipments and less-than-truckload quantities, applicant
found itself in the position of having to segregate the shipments
for billing purposes depending upon whether they were transported
pursuant to applicant's certificated or permitted authorities,
which has increased its cost to the customer. During the period
of suspension applicant proposes to file an application extending
its certificated authority. Applicant does not presently

transport the same type of commodities between the same points for any other customer.

After consideration the Commission finds that the granting of the application would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Commencing with the effective date of the tariff filings authorized in paragraph 2 hereof and concluding with June 1, 1967, M and M Transfer Company may suspend service as a highway common carrier on shipments of the following commodities between Union Carbide Corporation, Torrance, California and other points in applicant's certificated area:

- a. Synthetic Resins, N.O.I.B.N.
- b. Synthetic plastics, other than liquid N.O.I.B.N.
- c. Plastic Materials or Products, powder, granules, pellets, lumps, flakes
- d. Monofluorotrichloromethane
- e. Dichlorodifluoromethane
- f. Monochlorodifluoromethane
- g. Chemical, N.O.I.B.N. (Trichlorotrifluoroethane)
- h. Dichlorotetrafluoroethane
- i. Dichlorodifluoromethane-monofluorotrichloromethane
- j. Dichlorodifluoromethane-dichlorotetrafluoroethane
- k. Plastic Cups w/o handles, w/o filler, nested, capacity not exceeding 16 oz.
- l. Plastic Articles N.O.I.B.N. (6¢ to 12¢ per cu.ft.)
- m. Plastic Bowls w/o filler, nested
- n. Plastic film or sheeting other than cellulose, not transparent or translucent, N.O.I.

- o. Plastic handle blanks, nested in boxes, N.O.I.
- p. Plastic cups, drinking/vending nested in boxes, over 8¢ per cu.ft.
- q. Acetone
- r. Denatured Alcohol Solvent
- s. Paint and Varnish Solvents, N.O.I.B.N.
- t. Alcohol
- u. Acetate
- v. Isopropanol
- w. Chemicals, N.O.I.B.N.
- x. Glycol
- y. Methanol
- z. Paint and Varnish Plasticizer, N.O.I.B.N.
- aa. Sizing, N.O.I.B.N.
- bb. Clearing Compound, N.O.I.B.N. liquid
- cc. Lubricating Oil, N.O.I.B.N.
- dd. Cellosize (Plastic Material or Products)
- ee. Plastic, synthetic, N.O.I.B.N.
- ff. Plastic film or sheeting
- gg. Synthetic plastic sheets, sheeting or film
- hh. Furniture groups seats or swings
- ii. Proprietary anti-freeze preparation (ethylene glycol)
- jj. Proprietary anti-freeze preparation (methanol)

2. After the effective date hereof and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant

may amend its tariffs presently on file with the Commission reflecting the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
