ORDER TERMINATING SUSPENSION AND INVESTIGATION

On February 23, 1966, the Commission issued an order of suspension and investigation which suspended the effective date until June 23, 1966 of certain tariff sheets filed under Advice Letter No. 66-T, involving tariffs covering the offering of special telephone instruments not owned by the California-Pacific Utilities Company.

By letter dated March 2, 1966, the company requested permission to withdraw without prejudice its filing under Advice Letter No. 66-T until the Commission has rendered its decision in Cases Nos. 7839, 7933 and 8278 which involve the installation by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company of special telephone instruments not owned by them. Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The investigation instituted to determine whether said tariff sheets are unreasonable or unlawful in any particular is hereby terminated.

2. The rates, classification, practices or rules in the tariffs filed by Advice Letter No. 66-T are hereby canceled, without prejudice.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
