OPINION AND ORDER

By this petition, California Trucking Association seeks to have established revised minimum rates in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 for the transportation of soap and related articles between San Francisco Territory, Sacramento, North Sacramento and Stockton, on the one hand, and Los Angeles Basin Territory, on the other hand, and to have canceled certain exception ratings in Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 on buffing, polishing, cleaning, scouring or washing compounds. Petitioner requests that common carriers be directed to establish in their respective tariffs such modifications as may be prescribed by the Commission's orders in these proceedings, including relief from the long- and short-haul provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code.

Petitioner states that (1) the present rate and complementary exception ratings do not adequately reflect current circumstances

involved in the manufacture and distribution of soap and related articles; (2) commodity listings have not been updated to reflect new products; and (3) the rates have not been revised to reflect relationships with other commodities and with the changes in other tariff provisions which have affected their application.

Petitioner avers that its proposed tariff revisions would result in both increases and reductions of both a technical and practical application and that it has been advised by interested shipper groups that the present level of rates and charges is unreasonable and is affecting their distribution patterns. Petitioner asserts that the modernization of tariff provisions has been discussed by the shippers and carriers of soap products and that the adoption of the proposed tariff revisions is desired by them.

Copies of the petition were served upon various chambers of commerce, shipper organizations and carrier representatives. The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of February 7, 1966. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that petitioner's proposal is reasonable, that the resulting minimum rates will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates for the transportation of the commodities involved and that any increases which may result from the proposed cancellation of the exception ratings are justified. A public hearing is not necessary.

The Commission concludes that the petition should be granted. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 will be amended accordingly by the order herein. In order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 will be amended by separate order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix D of Decision No. 31606, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein to become effective May 23, 1966, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A, also attached hereto, which pages and appendix are by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than May 29, 1966; and tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with

this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
