SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. <u>70591</u> entered today in Case No. 5432 (Petition for Modification No. 407) and Case No. 7858 established revised minimum rates in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 for the transportation of scap and related articles between San Francisco Torritory, Sacramento, North Sacramento and Stockton, on the one hand, and Los Angeles Basin Territory, on the other hand, and canceled certain exception ratings in Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 on buffing, polishing, cleaning, scouring or washing compounds. The decision also provided that, in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 should be amended by a separate order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 (Appendix A of Decision No. 66195, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein to become effective May 29, 1966, Tenth Revised Page 3, Fifth Rovised Page 9 and Fifth Revised Page 20 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than May 29, 1966; and tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order

herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers, in canceling the exception ratings authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the canceled ratings published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects, Decision No. 66195, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
