SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 70651 entered today in Cases Nos. 5441 and 5439 (Petitions for Modification Nos. 101 and 42, respectively) provided that commodity descriptions for various exception ratings named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B, City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 9-B should be amended so that they will be designated by references to the particular item numbers of the Governing Classification wherein the commodities involved are described.¹

The above decision also provided that, in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Minimum Rate Tariff No. 9-B should be amended by a separate order in this proceeding.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 9-B (Appendix A of Decision No. 67766, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective July 22, 1966, First Revised Page 35 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
2. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the sixtieth day after the effective date of this order.

The above-named minimum rate tariffs are subject to the provisions of National Motor Freight Classification A-8 (CAL) as governed by National Motor Freight Classification A-8, collectively referred to herein as the Governing Classification.

and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff page incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the ratings authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the ratings published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects, Decision No. 67766, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.

<p>Except on articles described in the Governing Classification under the heading "Furniture Group," if two or more ratings are provided for an article in the form in which it is shipped (e.g., set up or knocked down, nested or not nested, compressed or not compressed, folded flat or not folded flat), subject to different packing requirements, the lowest of such ratings will apply.</p>
