 CITY OF ANAHEIM to Construct a City Street
 across the Right of Way of the Southern
 Pacific Railway Company at Pacifico Avenue
 (a new street). } Application No. 48054

ORDER

The City of Anaheim is hereby authorized to construct Pacifico Avenue at grade across the track of the Southern Pacific Company, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BK-512.7 in the City of Anaheim.

Width of the crossing shall not exceed 76 feet and grades of approach shall be not greater than two percent in accordance with plan attached to the application. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by four Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) supplemented with automatic crossing gates. Backlights may be omitted from the signals on the medians. Crossing shall not be opened to vehicular traffic until such protection has been placed in service.

Applicant shall bear the entire construction expense, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Southern Pacific Company shall bear the maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. The maintenance costs of the automatic crossing protection shall be borne by the applicant, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
