OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 names minimum rates, rules and regulations for the transportation of fresh or green fruits and vegetables and related articles by city carriers and highway permit carriers. By this petition, California Trucking Association seeks to have the above tariff amended with respect to the transportation of certain shipments on pallets and the empty return of such pallets. Petitioner asks that common carriers be directed to establish in their respective tariffs such modifications as may be prescribed by the Commission's order in this proceeding, including relief from the long- and short-haul provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code.

Petitioner proposes that a charge of 20 cents per pallet, minimum charge of \$1.00 per shipment, be established in the tariff for furnishing pallets of specific dimensions for the transportation of citrus fruits to certain destinations and that no additional charge be assessed for transportation of such pallets when empty.

The transportation applies to steamship docks, piers, wharves and railheads when the movements are in interstate or foreign commerce and are exempt from rate regulation by the Interstate Commerce Commission under the provisions of Section 203 (b)(6) of the Interstate Commerce Act. The dimensions of the pallets are not to exceed $36 \times 42 \times 5$ inches.

According to petitioner, special low-cost pallets have been designed for use in connection with the above transportation and standard loadings and procedures have been developed to meet the peculiar needs of the shippers and carriers involved. Petitioner avers that it is necessary that carriers own and control the pallets in order that maximum standardization, utilization and efficiency in operations may be obtained and that the carriers be reimbursed for the cost of the pallets in addition to the cost of transporting them.

Petitioner asserts that: (1) the proposed tariff revision was developed by a committee of interested shippers and carriers and has been reviewed by interested shippers and carriers and their representatives; (2) the charge proposed for the cost and transportation of the specialized pallets has been developed after an analysis of the special circumstances surrounding the transportation of citrus fruits; and (3) the charge will adequately compensate the carriers for the costs involved and will not hinder the present marketing practices of shippers.

Copies of the petition were mailed to various shippers and shipper associations on or about April 22, 1966. The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of April 28, 1966. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that petitioner's proposal is reasonable and that the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation involved, and to the extent that said rates and charges will result in increases, such increases are justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petition should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 (Appendix "C" to Decision No. 33977, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective August 6, 1966, Fifth Revised Page 30-B, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than August 6, 1966; and tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff page incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing longand short-haul departures and to this order.
